Overview

Pocono Film is providing Film, Marketing and Video Production Internships for 2012, Spring, Summer and Fall terms.

The intern will advance the following projects:

- Edit or work on the crew of a new TV show Pocono Backroads currently in production.
- Assist in production coordination activities and work with production companies.
- Photograph, log, and post locations to web site location database.
- Build database of local actors, vendors, and crew professionals.
- Work with property owners, community leaders and film industry professionals.
- Market the six county Pocono Region to Film, Video, Print, and Multimedia Companies.

Desired skills/resources:

- Background in theatre, film/video, marketing, or communications.
- Interpersonal Skills – ability to interface with community leaders and film professionals.
- Foster professional business relationships; good written and oral communication.
- Computers, including MS Office (Word, Excel, PowerPoint), Photoshop, Final Cut or Première.
- Communications, Theater, Film, Video, Marketing or related majors are encouraged to apply.

The position may include editing using a Final Cut Pro System, Audio Production, Television Production, working with professional film production companies, photographing regional locations, editing and resizing photographs, developing marketing materials, and working with local property owners, vendors, and community leaders.

Skills: Applicants should have superior written and oral communication skills, as well as a working knowledge of MS Office, Photoshop, Final Cut, or Adobe Première. Theatre, Film, Video or related majors are encouraged to apply. Transportation is required.
